Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Improve the vocabulary related to Christmas ▪ Improve speaking and writing skills ▪ Review vocabulary related to the family ▪ Review numbers ▪ Getting to know Bavarian Christmas traditions ▪ Cultural awareness of similarities and differences between Christmas traditions in learners 'country and in Bavaria
Procedure	<p>Activity 1 - Shopping at Munich Christmas Market</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The teacher gives a set of pictures to learners (group of 3 or 4) ▪ Learners have a look at the pictures and select articles they would like to buy as presents for Christmas for a given list of persons ▪ They give a reason for their choice of each present <p>Activity 2 – Dialogue – Pair work</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ One learner is playing the role of the merchant. He/she can choose what he/she would like to sell. ▪ The other is the customer. ▪ They play the dialogue. ▪ They change the role and play the dialogue again. <p>Activity 3 – With my money I can buy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The teacher asks learners to calculate what they can buy with the money of each purse. ▪ Collection of some answers on a board. ▪ Note: the currency can be changed. The prices should/could be adapted to the ones in the own country. <p>Activity 4 – About Christmas in Bavaria</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Learners watch the video clip (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mkeb5SHg4fo) ▪ They answer the questions (multiple choice) ▪ They comment similarities and differences between Christmas in Bavaria and in their country. They report about own traditions/family traditions. <p>Activity 5 - A Christmas letter to your friend in Bavaria</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Learners write a Christmas letter to a fictive friend in Bavaria. ▪ They have to give some specific information.

- f) What do you usually eat at Christmas Eve?

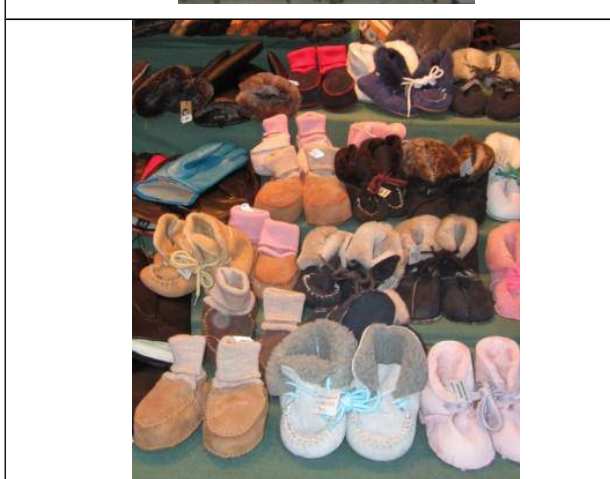
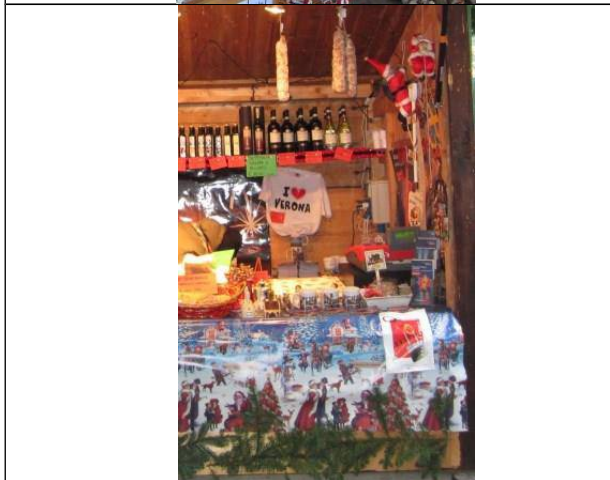
Activity 5 - A Christmas letter to your friend in Bavaria
